However, his primary focus was fundraising, with an aim of making £10,000 for the UK charity, Teenage Cancer Trust.
- ② Stephen's fundraising efforts were backed up by a large number of people who wanted to help him achieve his goals. After becoming very ill, Stephen posted several selfies in which he was smiling and giving a thumbs up as a thank you to his supporters. Instantly, people across the entire social media world, including celebrities were posting **theirs** while promoting his efforts. Despite his severe suffering, Stephen remained positive and focused on helping others.
- ③ On the day of his funeral, his supporters took to social media once more to post thumbs up selfies in his honour. It was wonderful how Stephen could inspire many with his fantastic story through his social media presence.

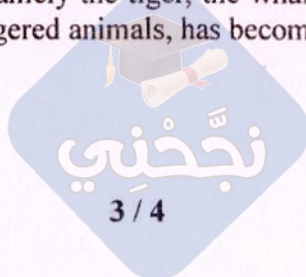
