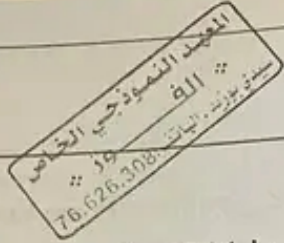


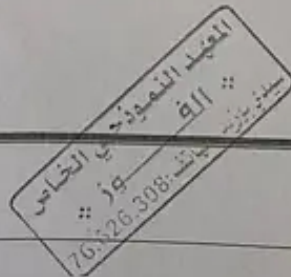
Text



(1) The Titanic was built in 1911 in Belfast, Northern Ireland. The ship was enormous - 882 feet long (approximately the length of three football fields) and 92.5 feet wide - and it was equipped with some of the most modern safety features of the age. In fact, The Titanic was thought that it was unsinkable. On her first journey, in April 1912, all the passengers were taken on at Southampton (England), Cherbourg (France) and Cork (Ireland). Life in the first class was luxurious: evenings were spent in the restaurants or listening to concerts.

(2) At 10 pm on Sunday 14th April, the Titanic was warned about icebergs in the area. But the Titanic continued to travel at high speed and an iceberg was hit at 11.45pm. Many passengers were woken by the shock. All crew was called onto the deck. The ship had 16 boats for only 1,200 people, instead of the 64 lifeboats of the original design. The lifeboats were put into the sea but many of them weren't filled. Many people still felt safer on board the Titanic!

(3) The band on board played music until the boat sank at 2:20 am on 15th April with 2,222 people on board. SOS signals were sent by The Titanic. Five other ships received these signals. A ship called The Carpathia rescued a few people. They were given hot drinks and dry clothes by the crew. 1522 people lost their lives. The Titanic dropped 2,5 miles to the ocean floor. Only 705 people survived.

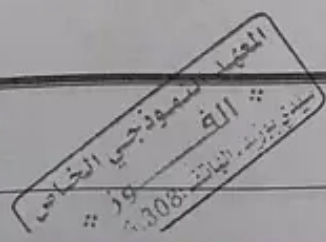

Aresearch suggests that it is not just the victims of cyberbullying that are more vulnerable to suicidal behaviours, but the perpetrators themselves are at higher risk of experiencing suicidal thoughts and behaviours as well. Cyberbullying is using electronic communication to bully another, for instance by sending intimidating, or **(threaten-threatening-threatened)** using social media.

The researchers say it shows an urgent need for effective prevention and **(intervention-interfere-intervene)** in bullying strategies. Professor Ann John said: "curbing cyberbullying should be included in school anti-bullying policies, alongside broader concepts such as digital citizenship, online peer support for victims, how an electronic bystander might **(inappropriately-inappropriate-appropriately)** intervene; and more specific interventions such as how to contact mobile phone companies and internet service providers to block, educate, or identify **(using-uses-users.)**" "Suicide prevention is essential within any comprehensive anti-bullying programme and should incorporate a whole-school approach to include awareness **(rising-raising-raises)** and training for staff and pupils.
